





With reference to your letter number I/RWF/9780/1C, dated the 1st December 1917, I am directed to inform you that the instructions issued by you for the late No: 355337, J.S. WILLIAMS, 25th Battalion, Royal Welsh Fusiliers, to be promoted to the rank of Sergeant under Army Council Instruction 115 of 1917, appear to be incorrect, as this man did not fulfil the conditions of the above Army Council Instruction, i.e., he was not holding the acting rank of Sergeant on the 19th January 1917 - If such is the case, the promotion authorised by you should be cancelled.

I am to point out that under Army Council Instruction 1701 of 1916, a soldier holding acting rank at home who proceeds overseas with a draft, relinquishes his acting rank from date of embarkation. It should be stated whether this man proceeded overseas with a draft and if so, were the instructions contained in the above Army Council Instruction complied with.




