Compiled and Published by order of the Imperial War Graves Commission, London. 1931. The particulars given in the Registers of the graves have been compiled from information furnished by the Record Offices and the next-of-kin. In all cases the relatives have been asked to furnish the personal information they wish to appear in the Register and where possible this has been given in their actual words. The manner of locating the graves recorded in these Registers does not conform to any uniform system, but follows the practice adopted by the governing authorities of the various cemeteries concerned. They are indicated by letters or numbers at the end of the individual name entries, which represents the Plot (or Section, Ward or Compartment as the case may be), Row (if any) and Grave. In many instances three-sub-divisions of the Cemetery are indicated, e.g., 51. 2. H.; in some only two are shewn, the first of which represents the Plot or Row, whichever it might be, and the second the number of the Grave, e.g., C. 33.; in others only the Grave number is shewn, or only the Row is indicated. In many cases only a general indication of position can be given.

Of the British soldiers, 154 belonged to the King's (Shropshire Light Infantry) and four to the Shropshire Yeomanry. The K.S.L.I. sent eight Battalions to service overseas. The Shropshire Yeomanry served in Egypt, Palestine, and France and Flanders.

The Registers are arranged alphabetically under the names of the Boroughs and Urban and Rural Districts in which the Cemeteries and Churchyards are situated. In the Rural Districts, the name of the Civil Parish is added where it differs materially from that of the burial ground.

The Registers record particulars of 600 War Graves.

SHREWSBURY GENERAL CEMETERY, MEOLE BRACE, on the Bishop's Castle road belongs to the Corporation, and covers about 27 acres. It contains 129 scattered War Graves (largely in Section 197), including those of one Belgian and seven German soldiers; another Belgian grave has been removed, as well as two American graves. A War Cross is erected at the main entrance.
