



## THE OSWESTRY MAXIM GUN.

On Thursday amid general rejoicing, the in-

habitants of Oswestry received into their charge the Maxim gun which they purchased in January, 1900, for service with the Shropshire contingent of the Imperial Yeomanry in South Africa. The occasion was taken advantage of for a military display. Major Gore, M.P., addressing the Mayor and members of the Corporation in front of the Guildhall, said he hoped the gun would remain for years on the historic spot in which they were placing it, to be a record to future generations of the gallantry of Shropshire yeomen .- (Cheers.) The Mayor, in receiving the gun, said Oswestrians were proud to give it a resting place in their municipal buildings.
